


☐ Soundweb London celebrates NZ debut



New Zealand: Jands Electronics New Zealand and Magness Sound Ltd have supplied the Auckland Trotting Club and Alexandra Park Function Centre, with 13 BSS Audio Soundweb London devices featuring the Harman HiQnet to control protocol. The Club is one of the city's leading horse racing venues and it's Function Centre, located in the Club's grounds, is one of Auckland's prime function venues. The Soundweb London system provides the foundation of the new audio network and incorporates the background music system, conference centre functions and race night audio for the Club's seven conference rooms, bars, main audience stands and function areas. The venue is spread over five levels, and the solution was to have 4 BLU-80 and one BLU-32 processors servicing the venue. 8 BLU-10 remotes are located in each conference area. All audio is transmitted digitally over the audio network using CobraNet, and the system is configured so that a total of 68 inputs and 76 outputs are distributed around the venue. The HiGnet London Architect software's comprehensive logic and preset recall facilities have been configured to allow the technician to assign specific race and program material to each of the conference rooms or public areas over the course of a race night, www.bss.co.uk
